1.0 Course Overview

4.0 Introduction to Creative Writing and Storytelling (3 Hours)

Objectives:

• Explore the foundation of storytelling and find your writer's voice

Topics Covered:

- What is Creative Writing? Genres and Styles
- The Power of Story: Why We Write
- The Writer's Toolbox: Voice, Perspective, Tone
- Overcoming the Blank Page

Activities:

- Freewrite: "The first line I've never written"
- Group Discussion: What makes a story stick?
- Task: Describe a memory using all five senses

5.0 Character Development and Voice (3 Hours)

Objectives:

• Bring characters to life with unique traits, motives, and evolution

Topics Covered:

- Protagonist, Antagonist, and Supporting Roles
- Creating Flaws, Goals, and Backstories
- Point of View: First, Second, and Third Person
- Finding and Maintaining Narrative Voice

Activities:

- Exercise: Character Profile Creation
- Prompt: Write from a character's point of view
- Group Task: Character interview and voice swap

6.0 Setting, Atmosphere, and World-Building (4 Hours)

Objectives:

• Learn how to immerse readers in believable, sensory-rich settings

Topics Covered:

- Time, Place, and Mood
- World-Building in Fiction and Memoir
- Show vs Tell: Descriptive Writing Techniques
- Symbolic and Thematic Settings

Activities:

- Guided Writing: Create a setting through sensory detail
- Visual Prompt: Describe a photo without naming the location
- Challenge: Build a world in 200 words

7.0 Dialogue, Structure, and Plot Techniques (3 Hours)

Objectives:

• Shape stories with meaningful scenes, arcs, and interaction

Topics Covered:

- Types of Conflict: Internal, External, Interpersonal
- Classic Plot Structures (Freytag's Pyramid, Hero's Journey)
- Writing Realistic Dialogue and Subtext
- Scene Craft and Pacing

Activities:

- Task: Write a scene with no narration only dialogue
- Group Exercise: Plot a short story arc
- Drill: Introduce a conflict and resolution in one page

8.0 Writing with Emotion, Theme, and Symbolism (3 Hours)

Objectives:

Deepen your writing by infusing it with meaning and emotional resonance

Topics Covered:

- Emotional Arc of Characters
- Universal Themes and Reader Connection
- Using Symbolism and Metaphor
- Writing with Vulnerability and Honesty

Activities:

- Prompt: Write a scene that evokes one core emotion
- Journal Task: What themes naturally appear in your writing?
- Group Review: Spotting and strengthening symbols in short texts

9.0 Polishing, Sharing, and Publishing Your Work (2 Hours)

Objectives:

• Learn the basics of editing, presenting, and submitting creative work

Topics Covered:

- The Editing Process: Self-Editing and Peer Editing
- Feedback Etiquette and Growth Mindset
- Sharing Work Publicly or Privately
- Introduction to Publication Options (Blogs, Journals, Competitions)

Activities:

- Peer Review: Workshop a short piece
- Task: Choose a piece to polish for submission
- Optional: Submit to a writing contest or blog
