and peer collaboration, building confidence in both writing and interpretation.

2.0 Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Identify and experiment with various poetic forms and styles
- Use poetic devices to create vivid and meaningful poems
- Analyze the structure, themes, and techniques of poetry
- Perform, revise, and publish original poetic works
- Appreciate poetry as both personal expression and literary art

4.0 Introduction to Poetry and Forms (3 Hours)

Objectives:

Explore the evolution of poetry and common poetic forms

Topics Covered:

- What Is Poetry? Emotion, Form, and Function
- Forms: Sonnet, Haiku, Free Verse, Villanelle, Limerick
- Rhyme, Rhythm, and Line Breaks
- Classical vs Contemporary Poetry

Activities:

- Writing Prompt: Create a Haiku based on nature
- Analysis: Compare a Shakespearean Sonnet and a Modern Free Verse
- Group Exercise: Create a collaborative Limerick

5.0 Language, Imagery, and Sound Devices (3 Hours)

Objectives:

Learn how poetic devices create impact and mood

Topics Covered:

- Imagery, Simile, and Metaphor
- Alliteration, Assonance, Onomatopoeia
- Enjambment and Caesura
- Tone, Mood, and Symbolism

Activities:

- Exercise: Write a poem using at least 3 sensory images
- Sound Lab: Explore rhythm and sound with spoken word excerpts
- Group Challenge: Find poetic devices in contemporary lyrics

6.0 Writing Personal and Experimental Poems (4 Hours)

Objectives:

• Express personal emotions and push boundaries through poetry

Topics Covered:

- Autobiographical and Confessional Poetry
- Found Poetry, Blackout Poetry, and Visual Techniques
- Persona Poems and Voice Play
- Repetition, Refrain, and Structural Experimentation

Activities:

- Prompt: Write a poem about a personal transformation
- Task: Create a blackout poem from a magazine or old book
- Workshop: Share and receive feedback on an original poem

7.0 Poem Analysis, Interpretation, and Feedback (3 Hours)

Objectives:

• Deepen understanding of poetic themes and construction

Topics Covered:

- How to Analyze a Poem: Structure, Meaning, Intent
- Interpreting Metaphor and Ambiguity
- Understanding Poetic Movements (Romanticism, Modernism, etc.)
- Giving and Receiving Constructive Feedback

Activities:

- Analysis: Annotate a selected poem line-by-line
- Group Discussion: Interpret meanings and symbolism
- Peer Review: Exchange poems and provide written critique

8.0 Performance, Voice, and Visual Poetry (3 Hours)

Objectives:

• Bring poetry to life through sound, visuals, and spoken word

Topics Covered:

- Reading Aloud for Rhythm and Emotion
- Slam Poetry and Spoken Word Fundamentals
- Lineation and Shape in Visual Poetry
- Staging, Delivery, and Confidence

Activities:

• Practice: Perform your poem aloud to a group

- Task: Turn a poem into a visual or digital artwork
- Showcase: Group slam poetry round

9.0 Editing, Submission, and Publishing Opportunities (2 Hours)

Objectives:

• Learn how to revise, format, and share poetic work

Topics Covered:

- Self-Editing Techniques and Poetic Precision
- Submission Guidelines for Journals and Contests
- Formatting and Titles
- Zines, Chapbooks, Blogs, and Online Platforms

Activities:

- Lab: Revise a poem for publication
- Task: Draft a cover letter or poet bio
- Discussion: Where and how to publish poetry
